

Money for Food

- Basic Allowance for Subsistence (BAS)
 - •BAS for enlisted members is \$368.29
 - You are eligible for BAS if you are:
 - Living off base
 - An Air Force dining facility is not available
 - •BAS is money the Air Force gives you to buy food












Air Force Dining Facilities

- Dining facilities feature a wide variety of choices










Air Force Dining Facilities












Housing

- •As an Air Force member, you will be entitled to live in on-base housing or receive Basic Allowance For Housing (BAH) if you live off base
- •On-base housing includes dormitories for single Airmen and family housing for married Airmen and Airmen with children.
- •Living on vs. off base is determined by rank, availability and preference









Dormitories

- •For single, unaccompanied Airmen only
- Airmen live in dorms at no cost
- •The Air Force covers utilities (gas, water, electric, etc...)
- Each Airman has his/her own bedroom
















Dormitories – Basic Floor Plan











Dormitories - Bedrooms










BAH, Off-base Housing and On-base Family Housing


- •If you are single and do not live in the dorms, you will, in most cases receive BAH
- You can use the BAH to secure an off-base house or apartment
- •You can rent or buy. If you buy, you own the home and can pocket any money made when you sell it
- •If you are married or have children you can live in On-Base family housing or receive BAH




BAH, Off-base Housing and On-base Family Housing

•If you live in on-base family housing, your rent will be automatically deducted from your BAH pay the rent on your house.




































































Commissary








Base Exchange – Like a civilian department store or a small sized mall. Items are sold at discount prices and tax free




Comprehensive Medical and Dental

- •All your medical and dental needs are covered
- You do not pay for medical insurance
- No co-pays
- •No sick days. If you are sick, injured or otherwise medically precluded from working, it doesn't count against you
- •All medications are paid for by the Air Force











Family Medical and Dental

- Your dependents' medical care will be covered under Tricare
- Tricare is a medical insurer
- If available, you dependents will be able to receive medical care through the on-base medical treatment facilities
- Co-pays are rare for medical care
- Dental care is covered by MetLife
- There are small co-pays for your dependents dental care









Retirement

- After 20 years of service,
 you will be eligible to retire
- •At 20 years your retirement pay will be 50% of the average monthly pay for the last 3 years of service
- You retirement pay begins the first month after your official retirement date
- •In addition to your retirement pay, you will have the opportunity to pay into the Thrift Savings Plan (like a civilian 401k) or Roth IRA

Advancement – Promotion System

Airman Tier – AB through SrA

- Promotions are scheduled and non-competitive
- Promotion from AB to Amn occurs after 6 months in Air Force
- Promotion to A1C occurs 10 months later after 16 months in the Air Force
- •Promotion to SrA occurs after 28 months as an A1C or 36 months in the Air Force...whichever happens first





Advancement – Promotion System

NCO Tier – SSgt through TSgt

- •Promotions are competitive. You compete against other Airmen in the same career field as you
- •The % of people promoted is roughly the same in all career fields
- You are given an overall merit based score and your score is compared to the scores of others in the same career field





Advancement – Promotion System

NCO Tier – SSgt through TSgt continued

- •If your score puts you within the percentage of those to be promoted, you are promoted (e.g. If the promotion rate is 20% and your score ranks you within the top 20 %, you will be promoted)
- Your score is based on the following factors:
 - Time at your current rank
 - Time on active duty
 - Performance reports
 - Medals
 - A test based on general military and Air Force Knowledge
 - A test based on knowledge of your career field

Advancement – Promotion System

SNCO Tier – MSgt through CMSgt continued

- Promotions to SMSgt and CMSgt are similar to the NCO tier
- Your promotion score includes all the factors used in other promotions with the addition of a score given by a promotion board
- •The promotion board is made up of senior military leaders. The board members review performance reports, medals and duty history. They score your records and that score is added to the other promotion factors






Travel

- Permanent Change of Station (PCS)
 - •A PCS is a move to a new base where you will be stationed for at least 2 yrs
 - The cost of the move is covered by the Air Force
 - Your family will accompany you to most permanent duty stations



Travel

- Temporary Duty Assignment (TDY)
 - •ATDY is a short term assignment that could last a couple of days or several months
 - You will receive extra pay to cover lodging and food (called per diem) while TDY
 - Your TDY location does not necessarily have to be on or near a base





Travel


- Vacations
 - Travel while using your 30 days of vacation per year
 - Save money by staying at on base lodging or at military resorts such as the Hali Koa Hotel in Waikiki, HI
 - •Save money on theme park tickets and other recreational activities by buy discounted tickets at your base's Information, Tickets and Travel (ITT) office







Basic Military Training


Training

- During Tech-school you will continue your basic military training










Training



Community College of the Air Force

- Worlds largest community college
- •Fully accredited through the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools
- You are automatically enrolled upon enlistment
- You start earning college credits during Basic Military Training
- Virtually all formal training is college accredited










Education

Community College of the Air Force

- •Earn your Associate's Degree using credits earned through your Air Force training, previously earned college credits and credits earned by taking classes in your off duty time
- Transcripts are free
- Provides a start to earning other degrees quickly and at minimal or no cost











Money for School

Tuition Assistance

- •Up to 100% tuition assistance for any classes you take in your off-duty time
- •Capped at \$250 per semester hour and \$4500 total assistance per year
- Can be used for a degree or technical program
- •Student must earn a C or better or repay the Air Force for cost of class
- No service commitment associated with the entitlement





Post 9/11 GI Bill

- Provides up to 36 months of benefits
- •Receive up to \$18,077.50 per year for tuition
- Receive housing and food allowances while in college
- •\$1000 Stipend for books and supplies
- Can pass it on to spouse & kids











Post 9/11 GI Bill

- •Yellow Ribbon Program offers scholarships from *some* private schools to make up the tuition difference for anything over cap
- •Benefits can be transferred to dependents
- Benefits can be used for up to 15 years after separation from the AF




Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) Scholarships

•POC-ERP offers active duty enlisted personnel who can complete all bachelor's degree and commissioning



- requirements within 2 years an opportunity for an early release from the active duty Air Force to enter the Air Force ROTC
- •Those selected separate from active duty Air Force, join an Air Force ROTC detachment and become full-time college students
- •The Air Force provides tuition/fees scholarship of up to \$18,000, an annual textbook allowance of \$900 and a monthly non-taxable stipend of \$250-500
- Allows students to apply up to the age of 33






Education - Commissioning Programs

Every year there are slots reserved for Airmen at the United States Air Force Academy. There are 85 slots reserved for Direct Appointment and 50 slots reserved for the Academy Preparatory School





Free Testing

- •College Level Examination Program (CLEP) Standardized tests are available in various fields of study. If you pass the test, you receive college credit as if you had taken the class. Test normally cost \$92 to \$107
- Undergraduate college entrance exams ACT & SAT
- Graduate school entrance exams GMAT, LSAT, GRE, etc...
